#### TARRANT AREA FOOD BANK

Founded in 1982, Tarrant Area Food bank is a regional, nonprofit clearinghouse for donated food. The Food Bank typically provides 1.5 million pounds of food each month to food pantries, soup kitchens, after-school programs, senior centers and other social service centers in 13 counties. Each month, these 300 hunger-relief partners, on average, distribute emergency groceries to 36,000 families and serve more than 500,000 meals and snacks on their own sites.
