But despite his best efforts, his income still hasn't been enough lately to keep up with the high cost of living. That's why it was a pleasant surprise when he stumbled upon the Central Storehouse Food Pantry, a TAFB Partner Agency.



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"We happened to look, and I said, 'What is that place?'" he recalls of first seeing the food pantry and stopping by just 30 minutes before it closed that day.

Now, Christopher can supplement his food budget with the nutritious groceries he picks up at the food pantry. The pantry is open Tuesdays and Thursdays and Malachi, 16, can also help his dad pick out food for their family.

When Christopher isn't working and Malachi's not in school, the two enjoy playing sports together as well as watching sports like wrestling. Malachi says his favorite wrestler is Roman Reigns.
