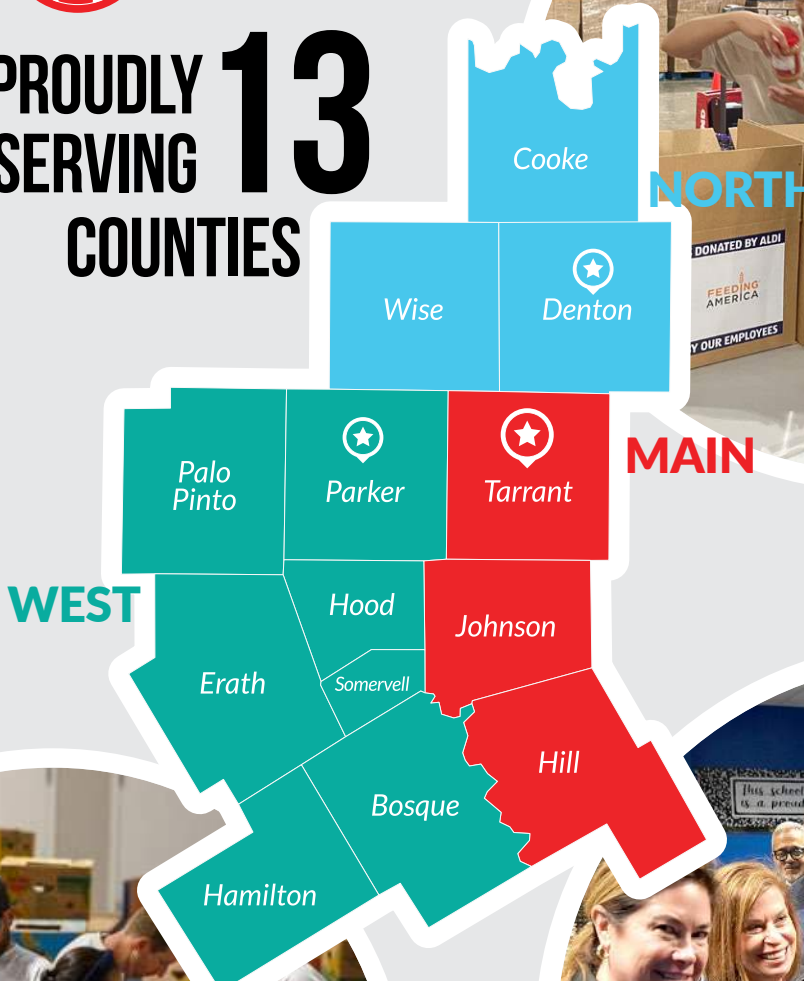

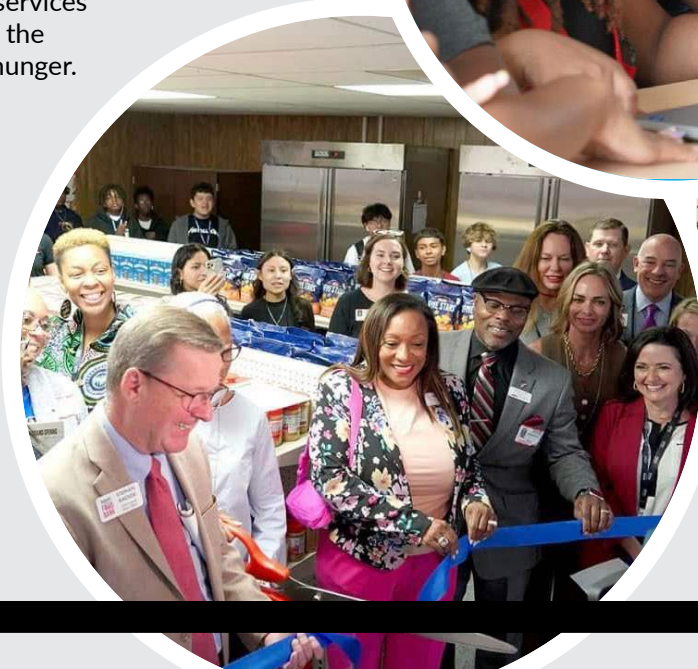

Tarrant Area Food Bank's Ready to Learn™ initiative alleviates childhood and college hunger by linking nutrition and education. Partnering with schools, colleges, and local agencies, the initiative provides meals, youth programs, and resources to help students thrive. Key efforts include expanding in-school markets, offering youth nutrition education, and establishing the Ready to Learn™ Community Resource Center at TAFB's Fort Worth headquarters. This center will feature a community market, cooking and nutrition classes, a children's learning garden, and other services addressing the causes of hunger.

TAFB's Government Relations team works to ensure no Texan goes hungry by advocating at every level of government for legislation that bolsters federal and state nutrition, health, and economic opportunity programs. In FY2024, TAFB was recognized by Feeding America as a 2024 Advocacy Hall of Fame honoree for its outstanding advocacy efforts. TAFB advocated for legislation that addressed hunger and causes of food insecurity.

Additionally, the government relations launched its inaugural Advocacy Bootcamps and Advocacy Advisory Council to co-develop legislative priorities and agendas with our network of partner agencies, community partners, Feeding Texas and Feeding America.
